Formerly known as the REA Cabin, the new structure represents a three-year undertaking to renovate the original cabin built in 1957 with funds donated by EMCs. Fast forward nearly six decades

when it became necessary for significant restorations that included structural repairs, new doors, exterior and interior finishes, new bathrooms, plumbing, heating and air, electrical, carpet and tile, painting and new built-in furniture.

They will be among 105 high school students during this event with stops in Georgia and Washington, D.C. The Washington Youth Tour is Georgia's oldest leadership program for teens. It is the premier event designed to reward deserving students for their hard work and their willingness to get involved in various leadership roles in their schools and communities. It helps bring to life what they have been studying about in the classroom. The WYT provides a "hands-on" experience as to the role of government, and the importance of community and public service. It provides an opportunity for exceptional students to meet face-to-face with members of Georgia's congressional delegation and visit historical points of interest in Georgia and the Nation's Capital.

The tour is fast-paced, dynamic, fun, and educational. It is a week-long, all-expenses paid trip that will provide them with a lifetime of friendships and memories. The tour commences in Atlanta with a dinner banquet held in their honor for being chosen as the EMC's delegate. The first day, the group will tour President Franklin Roosevelt's Little White House in Warm Springs, participate in leadership and educational sessions, and fly to Washington that afternoon. The balance of the week will be touring Washington. Visiting the War Memorials, Supreme Court, Arlington Cemetery, laying a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, Smithsonian Museums, Holocaust Museum, Mount Vernon, Ford's Theatre, and Washington National Cathedral are a few of the stops along the way. Visiting Capitol Hill and meeting with their congressional delegation are always a highlight of the tour. Cruising down the Potomac River on an evening cruise, dining at Union Station, Hard Rock Café, meeting with approximately 1,000 other students from across the nation, etc. are just a few of the fun highlights that will be encountered.

Grady EMC considers it an honor to sponsor these three students on the WYT. With this happening during their formative years, it is our hope that this event will open their eyes to the realities, possibilities, and opportunities that they might not have otherwise seen or considered.

"Nearly 60 years ago the EMCs helped fund one of the first of many cabins built by the shores of Lake Jackson. The new cabin will continue to host generations of campers who are learning to better themselves and our communities through FFA for years to come."

State Camp Director Todd Teasley recently pointed to the new wheelchair-accessible entry and bathroom—one of the only cabins at the camp with these features—and says this project has been the impetus to plan on refitting many of the facility's cabins with the same type of features. With the EMC Cabin complete, the building will be home to scores of FFA campers this summer.

The Georgia FFA-FCCLA Center is a non-profit educational facility designed with the purpose of providing the youth of Georgia with a site for leadership and career development. Started in 1937 as an FFA Camp for rural youth, it has evolved into a premier camp facility and conference center for the FFA and FCCLA Organizations, as well as many other youth and adult organizations. The Georgia

FFA-FCCLA Center is one of two FFA-FCCLA Centers in Georgia, and one of many FFA Centers throughout the nation. ■
